Option B is very narrow because it does not mention the negative effects of environmental cleanliness. Option D is off topic, but difficult because it uses verbiage in paragraph. The paragraph does not teach you how to clean the environment. Option C is correct because it covers the bottom of the entire paragraph without being too narrow or too wide. Let's get back to the question. Although Asperger's is a disorder that affects many aspects of a child's life, this paragraph is very broad that relates only to social interactions that get rid of Choice B. Choice B. Choice C is wrong because it only talks about one aspect of social interactions, which makes it very narrow. Option D is incorrect because, according to paragraphs – children with Asperger's are often equally friendly or equally divided into new acquaintances and old friends. Let's go back to the question The correct answer is very broad compared to D. Choice A, Choice D. Option D makes this separation. Option B is too narrow; mentions only two upgrades. Option C is incorrect. Let's go back to the question. Although Selection A is a good choice and acceptable if there is no other option, Option B is slightly more specific, which shows the role of the teacher specified at the end of the paragraph in the process. Option C is very wide; there is no mention of any other type of student in the paragraph. Option D is incorrect because the paragraph never specifies that students with special needs are students who have received any type of service. Go back to the question, the correct answer is B. Choice A is too narrow. It only appeals to the legend of King Arthur, not all the legends discussed in the first few sentences. The C selection is too wide. He never mentions King Arthur, the subject of the last half of the paragraph. Choice D is wrong because King Arthur's legend is wrong, an expression not made in the paragraph. Going back to the question, it can be difficult to learn how to properly configure an essay. With this Main Idea Tree, students will create an outline that allows them to better understand different parts of the five paragraph essay. Students will be asked to write their entries, the main idea is, three sentences, three supporting details and one result for each subject sentence.
